

#### Age and Artistic Growth: Rewriting the Language of Creativity

The relationship between age and artistic growth is a fascinating journey that defies the conventional notion of creative prowess diminishing with the passage of time. Contrary to the stereotype of youth being the sole harbinger of innovation and imagination, many artists find their true creative genius in the later stages of life. This phenomenon challenges preconceived notions, reinforcing the notion that artistic growth only gets richer and more profound with age.

Artists, like fine wine, seem to ripen with age. The passage of time allows for a deeper exploration of one's artistic identity, a quest for a distinctive voice that may elude the younger artist. This introspective journey often leads to a more profound connection with the chosen art form, fostering a level of creativity that is both personal and universally resonant. Some of the most celebrated artists in history, from Leonardo da Vinci to Titian to Monet to Louise Bourgeois to David Hockney, have exemplified the concept that artistic brilliance often peaks in later life. Their bodies of work, spanning decades, reveal an evolution that transcends the limitations of age demonstrating the resilience of creativity.

Artistic expression becomes a powerful vehicle for challenging stereotypes and fostering a more inclusive perspective. As older artists continue to create compelling and relevant works, they inspire a new conversation —one that embraces the potential for growth, innovation, and enduring artistic brilliance well into the later chapters of life. The narrative shifts from one of decline to one of resilience, with artists serving as living testaments to the capacity for continuous growth and creativity. This shift can potentially usher in a transformation in the way society views aging-rewriting the language of creativity.

#### EXHIBITING SECOND HALF CAREER ARTISTS





CAROLINE COLE trained as an architect, and is a British, contemporary ceramic artist. Her work explores relationships between shape, colour and light, using geometries to bring order to their potentially chaotic interactions. The combinations are endless and the nirvana of perfection is unattainable but the hope is to offer work that is both intriguing and joyful.



MARYAM EISLER is a London based photographer (and author) whose work is centred around the Sublime Feminine. Maryam is Chief Contributing Editor to LUX magazine. Maryam sits on the advisory board of Photo London; she is also a nominator for the Prix Pictet photography prize. Maryam is a graduate of Wellesley College and Columbia University.



FLEUR GRENIER MA RCA Nature plays a significant role in Fleur's artistic inspiration. The natural environment that surrounds her has influenced many of her sculptural pieces. Her recent series of artworks is titled "Home," showcasing her exploration of this theme. Fleur works predominantly in pewter and her work reflects a deep appreciation for the beauty and possibilities of pewter as a medium for artistic expression.



IKUKO IWANOTO is a Japanese artist living in London, whose intricate sculptural pieces are made from finely crafted porcelain. Ikuko's work has an uncompromising purity that is captivating. She describes her work as, "a world of intricacy and detail, of mathematical pattern and organic chaos, of beauty and repulsion. Ikuko has won numerous awards including the Ceramic Review Prize for Innovation at Ceramic Art London. Her work is in several public collections including the V&A.



HELEN JOHANNESSEN, MA RCA has been making and experimenting with ceramic surfaces since 1995. She has a bold, graphical style and is influenced by Bauhaus, Op Art, luminescence and subtle textures. Her most recent work explores porcelain surfaces, beautifully subtle and exquisite decoration, quietly impacting any interior or space.



OBJEKTI was created by Benjamin and Miriam Frowein who discovered the pines on a trip to Mexico and instantly fell in love with these unique and rare pieces. The whimsical pieces are made from local clay with elaborate detailing and exceptional craftsmanship, bringing striking art to your home.



MICHÈLE OBERDIECK MA RCA was born in Canada, and is now an artist and designer based in London. Trained as a textile designer at Glasgow School of Art, she ran her practice in Oxo Tower in London for 12 years before embarking on an MA at the Royal College of Art where she became captivated by blown glass. She is represented by several galleries in the UK and recently was selected to exhibit in Collect Open, Venice Glass Week, the European Prize for Applied Art Exhibition 2022 in Belgium, and the Irish Glass Biennale.



IAN THOMPSON MA RCA went to Camberwell and Canterbury to study fine art. Since 2006 Ian has been studying ceramics and specifically throwing, combining with painting and relief techniques. His work explores a range of ideas using characters from mythology and literary sources. He received a MA at the Royal College of Arts in 2016.



DEREK WILSON consistently challenges his discipline as a ceramicist. He combines his minimal aesthetic with craftmanship, a wealth of material knowledge and a propensity to propel modern ceramics through reinterpretation of its form. A search for simplicity of form draws inspiration through mid-century painters, the modernist movement, British and Russian constructivism and the history of the ceramic industry in Europe and Asia.

Linder Sterling, born in Liverpool 1954, is known for her photography, radical feminist photomontage and confrontational performance art. Emerging from the Manchester punk and post-punk scenes in the 1970s, Linder's photomontages focus on questions of gender, commodity, and display.

Linder's work has been exhibited widely, including recent solo exhibitions at Hatton Gallery, Newcastle upon Tyne; Kettle's Yard, Cambridge; Chatsworth House (Linder was their first ever artist in residence), Derbyshire; Nottingham Contemporary, Nottingham; Art On The Underground, London; Blum & Poe, Los Angeles; Tate St.Ives; Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art, Gateshead, and MoMA PS1, New York. In 2021, Linder was included in the Liverpool Biennial, Liverpool. There will be a new show in later 2024 at Stuart Shave/ Modern Art Gallery, Mayfair, London of her new work.
